The TEACH Grant provides up to a maximum yearly amount of \$4,000 in grants to students who agree to teach full-time for at least four years as a highly qualified teacher in a high-need field, school, or educational service agency (ESA) serving low-income students.

IMPORTANT: If you do not meet the terms of your TEACH Grant service obligation, all TEACH Grant funds that you received will be converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan that you must repay in full, with interest charged from the date of each TEACH Grant disbursement.
